Q 13 What do you see as the key impacts of Climate Change on the Sunshine Coast?

Response:

Researchers at the Australia Institute have reported that summers are getting longer and winters are getting shorter and this is more pronounced in regional areas.

This is increasing the length of the bush fire season and potential for catastrophic fire events.

Weather patterns seem to be changing with extreme weather events becoming more significant and longer lasting. The most significant impact being higher storm surges larger spring tides and far greater risk of flooding from sea level rise.

With the increasing temperatures and longer summers cyclonic activity is likley to increase and come further south. The intensity of cyclonic weather systems will increase and have greater impacts.

Year by year the change is perhaps negligable however over more meaningful time periods we are going to experience coastal erosion and river plain flooding / inundation. Hotter summers and warmer winters.

There will be climate change induced natural disasters until such time as the reaction changes from disaster response to proactive mitigation of human influenced climate change.

Q 14 How should the Sunshine Coast Regional Council deal with this now and into the future?

Response:

I will put forward a motion to declare a climate emergency.

This is a mobilising statement and the use of the word emergency signals that we need to do far more far faster than the usual speed of progress and change.

Embed climate emergency action in all council strategies, plans and actions, in particluar the planning scheme and Transport Plans. Build environmentally logical developments that reduce energy use and take advantage of natural environment, and transport schemes that reduce car journeys and increase public transport use.

Reach out and collaborate with and learn from the work of other councils that have already done this and made progress.

Reduction of CO2 in the atmosphere and a target of zero emissions, for example a zero emission, 100% renewable powered public transport system that is able to meet the travel demands and reduce overall private vehicle trips.

Revegetation and maintain mature growth and native forests when considering new developments - create and protect urban forests.

I will always be looking towards the future and how the decisions today will impact today but also how will this look in 20, 50, 500 years time.
